Project

As part of their work on the environment, Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly airports opened their Environment Partners Clubs in 2003 and 2005 respectively.

Purpose

The purpose of these structures is to commit companies operating at the airports to implementing an Environmental Management System covering their operations and to thereby make Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly truly environmentally friendly airports. Today, these clubs, in addition to offering a resource centre for best environmental practices, are becoming the new driving forces behind the airport Environmental Management Systems.

Working

The Environment Partners Clubs at Paris-Charles de Gaulle and Paris-Orly airports operate on the basis of the three pillars that form an Environmental Management System:

- **Gathering information:** An internet site called the environment extranet serves as the platform for exchanges between companies. This is also the place where airport environmental news is released and for listing the best practices applied by the various parties. This media is supported by a quarterly newsletter. The extranet was designed by club members to reflect their needs.
- **Training staff/raising awareness:** An awareness working group was created to build up tools for mobilising staff members. In 2004, a CD-ROM was produced, in 2005 a poster and sticker kit was produced as part of Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport's third successive year of participation in Sustainable Growth Week. In 2006, there was a training course covering "the responsibilities of the environment correspondent".
- **Self-evaluation:** An eco-map working group has been set up. This group has made it possible to bring online a simplified environmental diagnostics tool called 'eco-map'. This is a three page mini-questionnaire under the headings: Evaluating your Main Environmental Impacts; Evaluating your Actions to Manage these Impacts; and Evaluating your Environmental Management System in Five Points.

Today around a third of employees at Paris-Charles de Gaulle airport work for companies with an Environmental Management System.

Company profile:
